A verb is a "doing" word. It describes an action, for example

- ran Decon ran to the pasta bar.
- sneezed Harry sneezed loudly.
- tiptoed Layton tiptoed into the classroom.

Some verbs are more like instructions, things that you must do, these are called Imperative verbs.
