


lead subject: History

New knowledge we will acquire:

- Britain went to war when Germany invaded Poland on 1st September 1939.
- The Battle of Britain was fought in the air.
 The Royal Airforce defended Britain from a German attack
- Hull suffered badly in the Blitz killing many people
- Hull was the most severely damaged city during second world war, with 95% of houses damaged.
- In film and television, the British and their allies are often presented as heroes
- Children were evacuated from cities to the countryside to keep them safe from the bombing
- Memorials remember the pilots who fought in WW2
- We remember all people who have been affected by war on Remembrance Day







Learning activities we will complete:

- We will be looking at key events in chronology order which resulted in Britain going to war.
- We will engage in role play putting forward, then debating the arguments for and against appeasement.
- We will research questions and materials to compare account of events from different sources.
- We are going to recreate a scene form the Blitz to develop an understanding of how children felt during the war.
- We are going to research how Hull suffered badly in the war and record key facts.
-]We are going to make a collage of images showing how the British are represented and another of how the Germans are represented during the war
- We will use war memorials to find out about the past and design our own memorial for the air force.
